CONSTRUCTION SKILLS HUB LUTON

OVERVIEW

Being the appointed supplier for operated plant services for the Luton DART project being delivered to Volker Fitzpatrick & Kier as a joint venture, M O'Brien was proud play a role in the development of the Luton Dart construction skills hub. A dedicated training environment designed to increase the number of Icoal people being trained for construction, tackling the skills shortage and help build the infrastructure needed in the area.

ACTIVITY

The Luton DART Construction Skills Hub is an exciting opportunity providing support for local people to benefit from industry-relevant practical training leading to recognised, construction-specific qualifications.

The tailored support and qualifications available offer local people the opportunity to upskill and prepare to take advantage of the increase in construction-related jobs and apprenticeships available through local construction and infrastructure transformation schemes such as the Luton Investment Framework. The Skills Hub Academy will give over 700 local people the chance to train in the most needed skills, with a focus on attracting candidates from groups currently under represented in construction.

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BENEFITS

Investing in skills and the training of our people is something that we take great pride in at M O'Brien Plant Hire, so when the call came to support the initiative, we delivered 3 new machines straight to the project with no charge so that local people from Luton can receive training on these machines and get a great introduction to the construction industry. The Hitachi ZX55U excavator and Neuson DV60 Dual view Dumper demonstrated the kind of machinery they could potentially be operating in the future and many were surprised by the level of comfort offered within the cabs of modern Plant and machinery. We provided the project with CPCS plant trainers to carry out initial assessments of candidates to select people with the potential to become a fully trained plant operator and undergo training and CPCS assessment.

Following on from each wave of training delegates, selected operators were offered the opportunity to carry out some work experience so they could try out the role for real prior to committing. Over the course of the project, M O'Brien took on 6 operators to continue training, who went on to become qualified Dumper and Roller operators working full time on the project.

The skills hub provided a much needed kick start to bring new people in to the industry and has successfully worked with a number of local small community groups and youth centres as well as; Luton councils passport to employment program, Luton youth offending service, and the princes trust.
